- » To promote rural development programs.

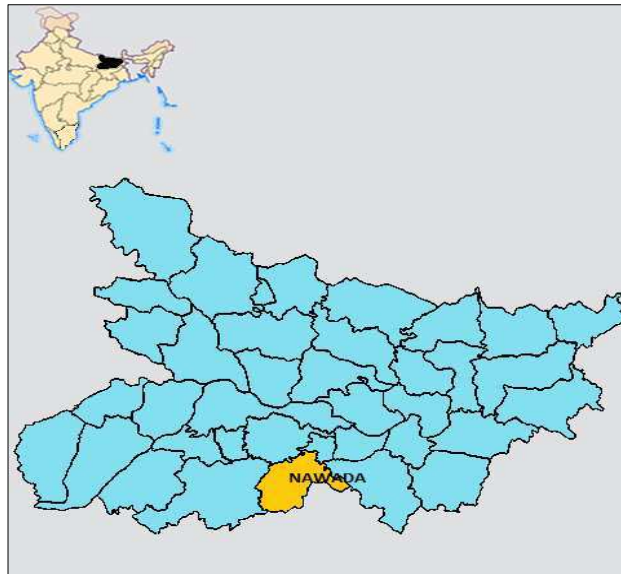
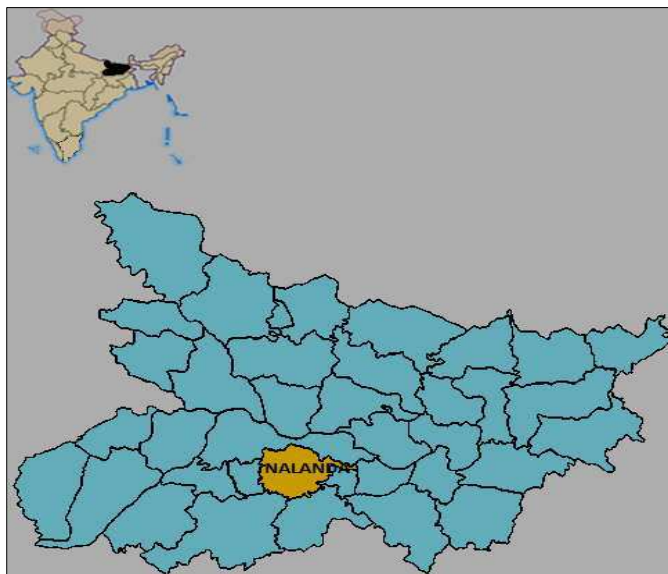

PROGRESS DURING THE PERIOD

■ **YOUTH NEED ASSESSMENT PROGRAM**

There is widespread prevalence of exclusion and discrimination against Dalits, Adivasis, Muslims and other socially excluded communities in our society, and the specific vulnerabilities of women, children and youth within these communities, as regards access to education, employment and governance. Poverty, disability, physical/geographic in-accessibility, forms of illnesses and other context specific characteristics make the picture more complex, demanding sustained efforts in unraveling and addressing exclusion independently and interjectionally.

DJKS is working to bring together the youth of the excluded communities and consistent interventions are made to assess their different needs. In 2017-18, DJKS was supported by Centre for Social Equity and Inclusion, New Delhi to conduct a survey of the Dalit youth of the 15-35 years age group through mobile apps. A three month survey (January-March, 2018) successfully conducted in Nalanda district in the Bihar through which 200 Dalit youth (male and female) in the age group 15-35 years were successfully

surveyed. This survey was helpful in mapping of the needs, wants, demands, expectations & aspirations of the marginalized youth. During the survey data related to the demographics and economic conditions, educational status, unemployment and entrepreneurship, aspirations, barriers to inclusion, influences (positive and negative), infrastructure available and requirements for equity and inclusion were covered.

After the survey, a list of the youth of the Dalit community has been prepared and efforts are going on to link them with CSR for employment and entrepreneurship opportunities. During the survey, most of the youth showed their concern over the lack of opportunities and guidance that is blocking their ways for a better future.



■ **PARA LEGAL TRAINING PROGRAM**

The Legal Aid movement is indeed at the crossroads today. The agenda for improving access to justice is an important part of social policy. At one level, social distinctions based on caste, class, gender and ethnicity impede the ability of citizens to approach the judicial system. At the same time, the limited reach of the judicial system further creates the conditions for more inequality since the oppressed sections are unable to seek redress for their injuries and grievances.

In 2017-18, DJKS organized Para Legal Training Program on 1.7.2017 at Shekhodeora Ashram in Kawakol block in Nawada district in Bihar with the support of Indian Social Institute, New Delhi. A total of **30** participants (female) participated in the training program. Ms. Chunni Kumari, Zonal Trainer of Shanti Sadbhawna Manch, Bihar narrated in details about the Fundamental Rights-(Paragraphs 14-32) to the participants along with the topics like Right to Equality and Constitutional Rights. The effect of the program was good and the legal knowledge of the participants has now very much improved.



■ **CELEBRATION OF BAL MAHOTSAV**

Supported by Indian Social Institute, New Delhi a “Bal Mahotsav” was organized by DJKS in the Middle School, Daulachak in Nalanda on 19.01.2018. A total of **190** children participated on the occasion and displayed their talent through the spectacular presentations like speech on freedom fighters, Rangoli, puppet show and cultural programs. During their presentation, children also called for the ending of social evils like dowry, child-girl discrimination, unemployment and illiteracy from the society.

Prizes were distributed to successful children in different categories by Father Joy Kariyapuram, Director and Mr. Pascal Tirki, Program Officer of Indian Social Institute, New Delhi.



■ PEACE & HARMONY PROGRAM

With the support of Indian Social Institute, New Delhi- DJKS has formed 16 “Shanti-Sadbhavna Manch” in the schools and villages to promote peace and harmony in the society. These Manch are promoted by DJKS in April-May, 2017 in Nalanda and Nawada districts in Bihar. The representatives of Indian Social Institute periodically imparted training to the members of this Manch and make them capable to work for maintaining communal harmony and peace in the society.



■ LEPROSY (SELF-CARE) PROGRAM

Despite many efforts, leprosy that termed as a dreaded disease after polio still continues to haunt us. But the worst part of it, those affected by the disease continue to face social stigma and discrimination. Unfortunately, Bihar accounts for maximum number of leprosy cases in India with a prevalence rate of 1.12 per 10,000. It has more than 11,000 leprosy cases at present, which accounts for 14% of the total leprosy cases in the country. Under the new case category, Bihar accounts for 16.20% cases. In Bihar, the disability rate among leprosy patients is also high as 8%.



In 2017-18, DJKS organized awareness on self-care to Leprosy patients in five (05) blocks of Nalanda district namely Silao, Rajgir, Giriya, Katrisarai and Biharsharif. With the sincere effort of DJKS, **148** leprosy patients benefitted.

■ **DISABLED WELFARE PROGRAM**

A Sensitization Workshop on “Rights and Entitlements of Persons with Disabilities” was organized at the DJKS office in Pawapuri in April, 2017. A total of **36** disabled attended the workshop. Experienced resource persons participated in the workshop and informed participants about the initiatives taken up by the Government for the welfare of Persons with Disabilities. They were also sensitized on Rights and Entitlements of Persons with Disabilities and about different govt. schemes and programs for the welfare of Disabled. In different sessions of the workshop following aspects were discussed:

- (1) The meaning of 'disability' and about the barriers. It was emphasized on four things to break the barrier and open the doors for Persons with Disabilities. These are Awareness, Participation, Comprehensive accessibility and Mainstream inclusion.
- (2) Brief information on some of the govt. programmes like Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, National Rural Health Mission, Rashtriya Madhyamik Siksha Abhiyan and livelihood, etc. was also discussed which ensures inclusion of Persons with Disabilities on equal basis.
- (3) Information was also shared on various steps taken by the Government to create a barrier free environment for Persons with Disabilities and build a society which is more inclusive to them.
- (4) Information was also shared on disability pension and disability certificates.



Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Subodh Kumar Ravidas, Secretary of DJKS said that we have to become more sensible to the needs and problems of Persons with Disabilities and exclaimed that the most important thing to recognize is that Disabled are also human and this gives an opportunity for all to recognize humanity in each one. A positive feeling should be created for disabled in the society, so that they can come forward in life.

The participants also expressed their feelings and said that there is great need for sensitization programs at regular basis. They also feel that provision of assistive aid and appliances, educational, vocational training, assistance for employment and training and hassle free distribution of disability certificates will help them for an empowered life.

■ **ENVIRONMENT AWARENESS PROGRAM**

Environment constitutes a very important part of our life. To understand life without studying the impact of environment is simply impossible. The need to protect

environment can be ignored only at our peril. But the common masses in rural part of Bihar are ignorant on this important aspect.

In 2017-18, environment awareness camps were successfully organized in Surumpur and Nanand villages in Silao block of Nalanda district. A total of **31** people (Male- **22** and Female-**9**) participated in the awareness camps and were sensitized on the importance of the protection and preservation of environment. The participants were told that environmental degradation poses a great danger to man's own survival. It should be realized, sooner than later that conservation and improvement of the environment are vital for the survival and well being of mankind.



Natural resources of land, air and water have to be used wisely as a trust to ensure a healthy environment for the present and future generations.

Free distribution of **100** saplings of fruits and medicinal trees like Guava, Lemon, Shisam and Neem were done among the villagers to plant them in and around their homes by DJKS.

■ **SEMINARS, WORKSHOPS, MEETINGS & CAMPS**

DJKS believes that information dissemination is important for the development of the human being and society. In 2017-18, DJKS organized regular seminars, workshops and camps on relevant topics in Nalanda and Nawada districts in Bihar. A good number of participants that involved MNREGA workers, Dalit/Mahadalit men and women and disabled were benefitted by the program. Experienced resource persons and eminent personalities shared their knowledge and views on these occasions and made these events a success. The details are as follows-

■ **VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM**

In 2017-18, DJKS imparted a 4 month vocational training course from 1.5.17 to 31.08.18 to **30** poor and needy women in “Sewing and Cutting” trade in Giriyak block in Nalanda district in Bihar. The women learnt the sewing and cutting skills sincerely that is now helping them to improve their poor economic situation. In training program, preference was given to “Dalit” women. As an integral part of the program, beneficiaries were also imparted entrepreneurship development training. Certificates have been distributed to all the trainees after the completion of training that is now helping them to generate income and live a good life.

Computer proficiency is increasingly essential for relevance in today's computer-driven society. DJKS is very much committed to empower Dalit youths through computer training. A computer training program was organized by DJKS in May- June, 2017 in Pawapuri. A total of **35** Dalit youth (boys and girls) were benefitted by the program.

■ **DALIT DIGNITY AWARENESS PROGRAM**

Dalit community across South Asia, irrespective of their faith, continues to suffer several social disabilities arising out of the acute caste discrimination which is still rampant in many parts of the sub-continent. In addition to discrimination against Dalit which is laid bare in all spheres of life, severe forms of abuse and violence are inflicted on them daily. DJKS strives to eliminate caste discrimination that change to bring full dignity and equality to Dalit in Nalanda district in Bihar. In 2017-18, DJKS undertook following programs for reducing discrimination and improving the overall situation of Dalits in the society.



a. **Dalit Dignity & Awareness Program**: Series of awareness camps and meetings were organized in May, 2017 for promoting the rights and entitlements of Dalits. On this occasion, relevant topics like ‘social inclusion’, ‘empowerment’ and ‘right based’ approaches, SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act 1989, Domestic Violence Act and filing of RTIs were covered in length. On the occasion, participants were also informed about the life and works of Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar. A total of **65** Dalit men and women benefitted by the program.

c. **Dalit Adhikar Yatra**: To mobilize Dalits about their rights and entitlements, a “Dalit Adhikar Yatra” was organized in June 2017 by DJKS. A distance of 2 km from village Surumpur to village Bararkar in Silao block was covered by the yatra. A total of **115** men, women, youth and children of the Dalit community actively participated in the yatra and gave a strong message to the society about their rights and entitlements.

d. **Literacy Program**: The literacy rate among the SC/Dalits in Bihar has been dismally low at a mere 28.5 percent during the 2001 census, which is nearly half of that recorded for all SC population at the national level (54.7%). The male and female literacy rates are 40.2 percent and 15.6 percent respectively against the corresponding national figures of 66.6 percent and 41.9 percent. Among the literates, 39.7 percent of the SC are either without any educational level or have attained education below primary level. In Surumpur and Brarkar villages in Silao block in Nalanda district illiteracy among SC/Dalit women is high. To make these women literate, a literacy drive was organized in village Surumpur and Barakar through which **14** women benefitted.

■ **WOMEN RIGHTS/ADHIKAR PROGRAM**

DJKS organized an awareness program on the occasion of International Women’s Day on 08/03/2018 at Pawapuri in Silao block in which **115** Dalit women participated. The program provided right awareness among the participants on advancing women’s rights, equality and participation in the decision making process.

During the program, women shared their experiences and expressed collective declaration for their rights and dignity.

■ **PANCHYATI RAJ AWARENESS PROGRAM**

The 73rd Amendment Act is a revolutionary step towards establishment of grass-root democracy in the country. It is a bold step to strengthen rural people in economic, political and administrative fields through decentralization of authority and power. Despite making Panchayati-Raj a constitutional body and implementation of a large number of development schemes, this has not achieved much needed success in rural development. Hence, there is a need to make rural people in Bihar more aware on the Panchayati- Raj system.



On 14.04.2017, an awareness camp was organized in Mohanpur village in Silao block. A total of **85** men and women now become more familiar about different govt. schemes and programs implemented at the Panchayat level.
